



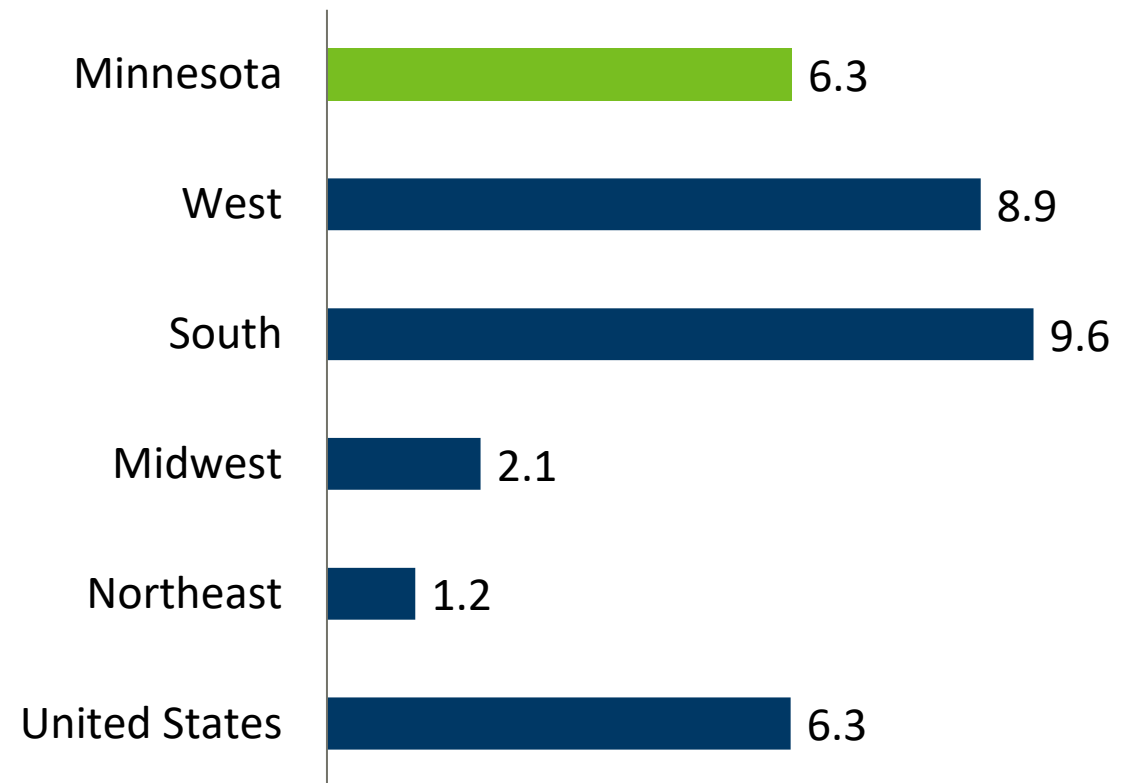

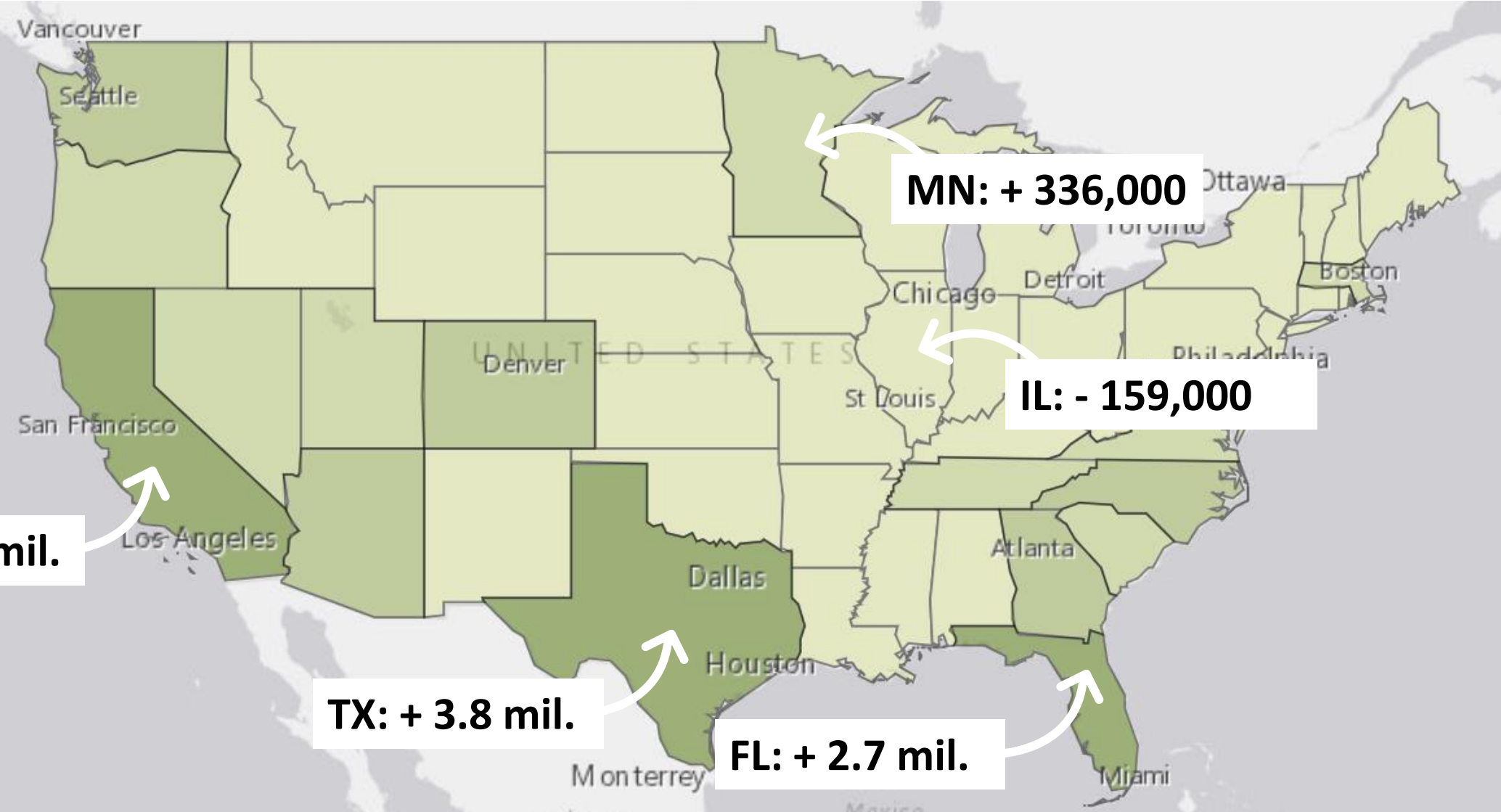
Minnesota's population at-a-glance

- Minnesota's 2019 population was estimated to be 5,639,632
- Minnesota's population grew 6% between 2010 and 2019, adding 335,705 residents.

Percent change in population 2010-2019

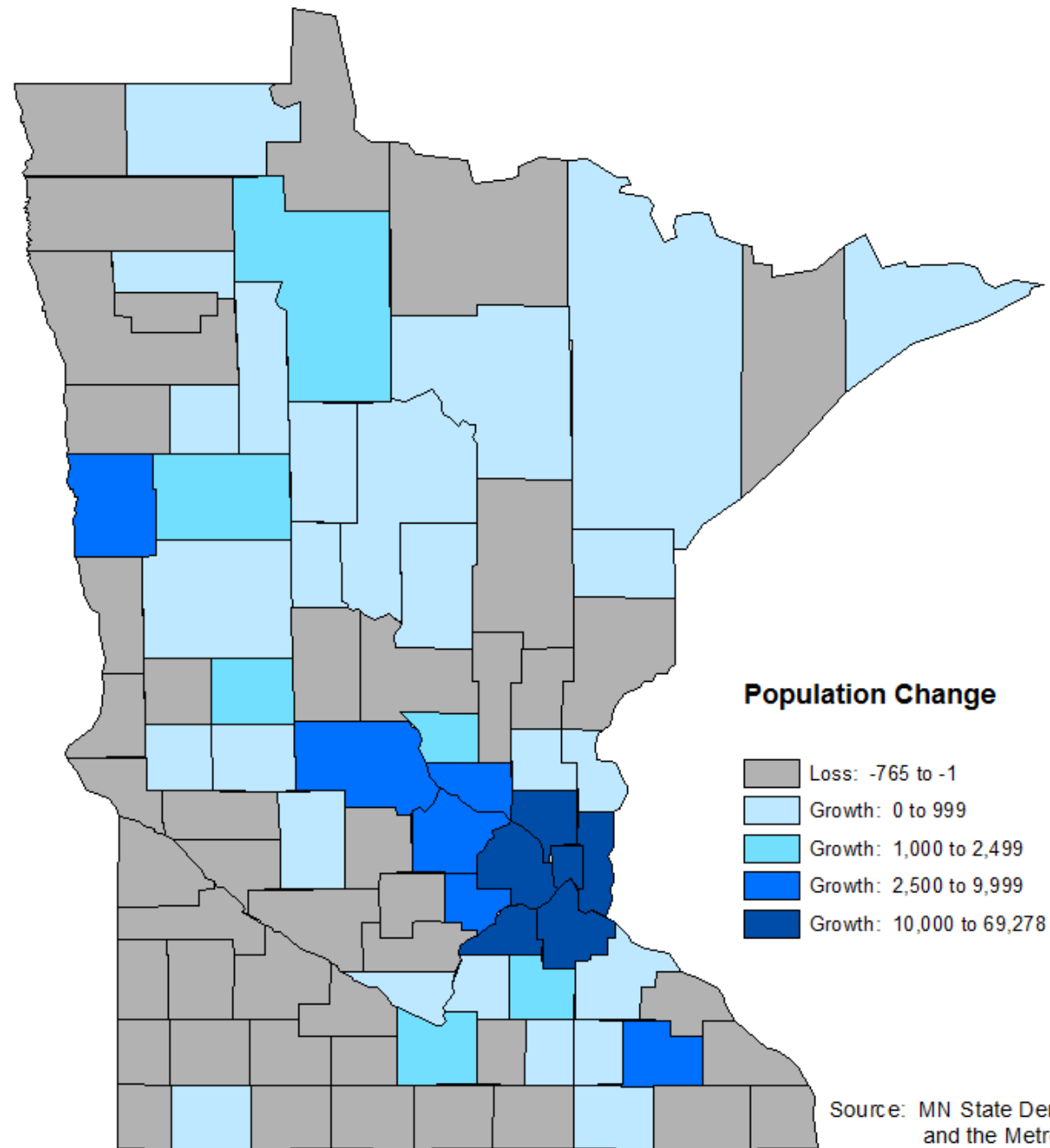


Population change in other states...for scale 2010-2019



2010-2019

- 80% of the state's growth occurred in the Twin Cities 7-county metro.
- Hennepin and Ramsey added 153,000 jointly, 46% of the state's growth.

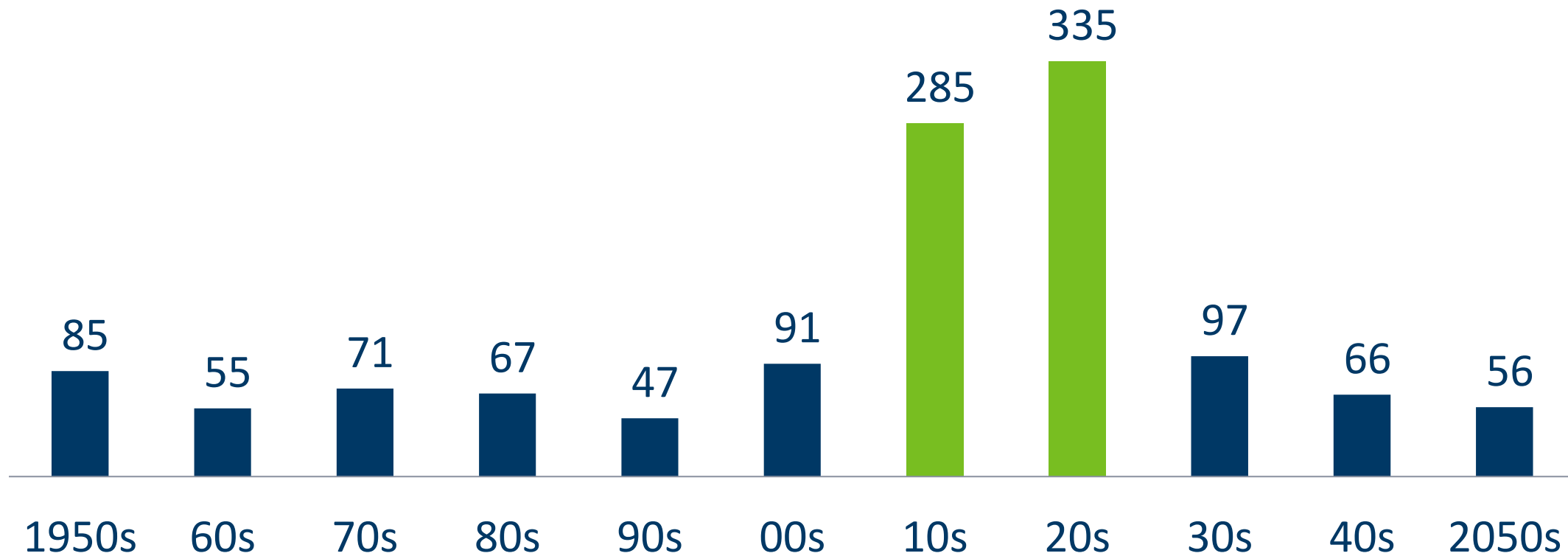
Population trends do not always equal enrollment trends

- Population growth is sometimes driven by households without children



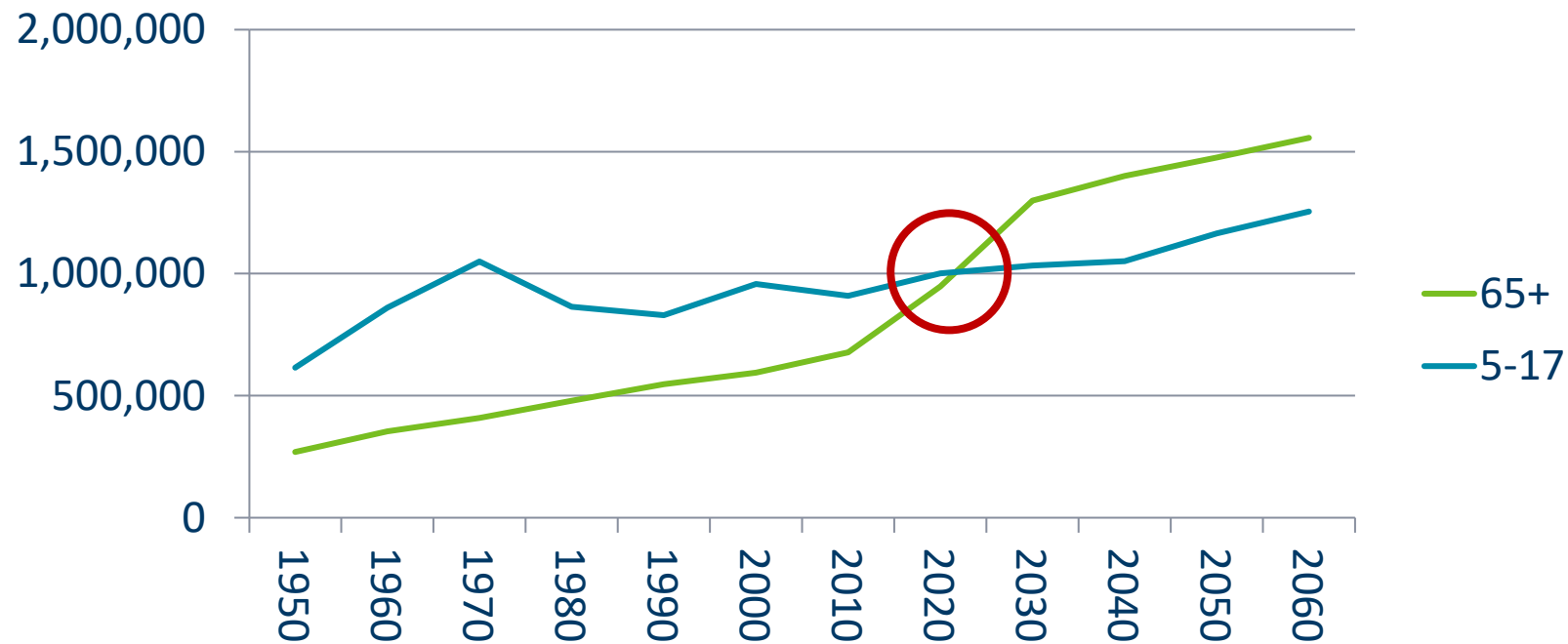
This decade and next: Unprecedented increases in MN's 65+ population

Change in older adults, age 65+ (in thousands)



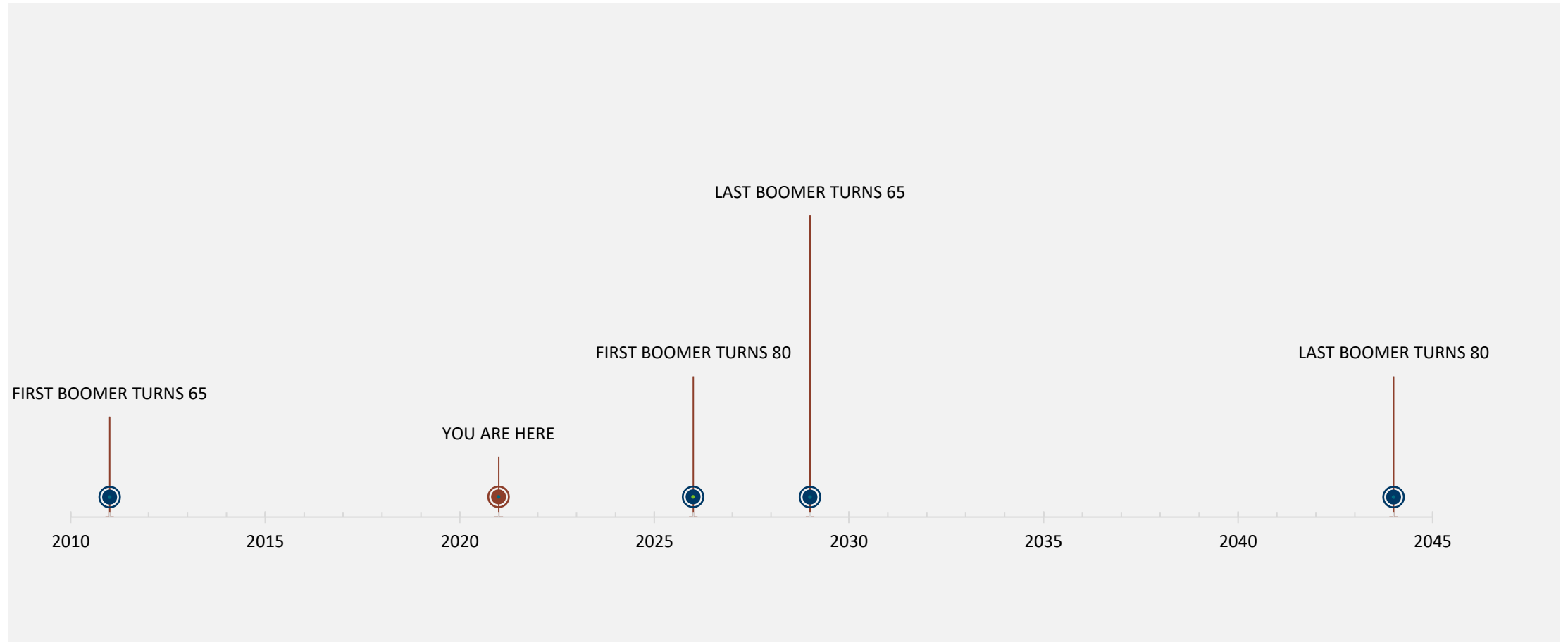

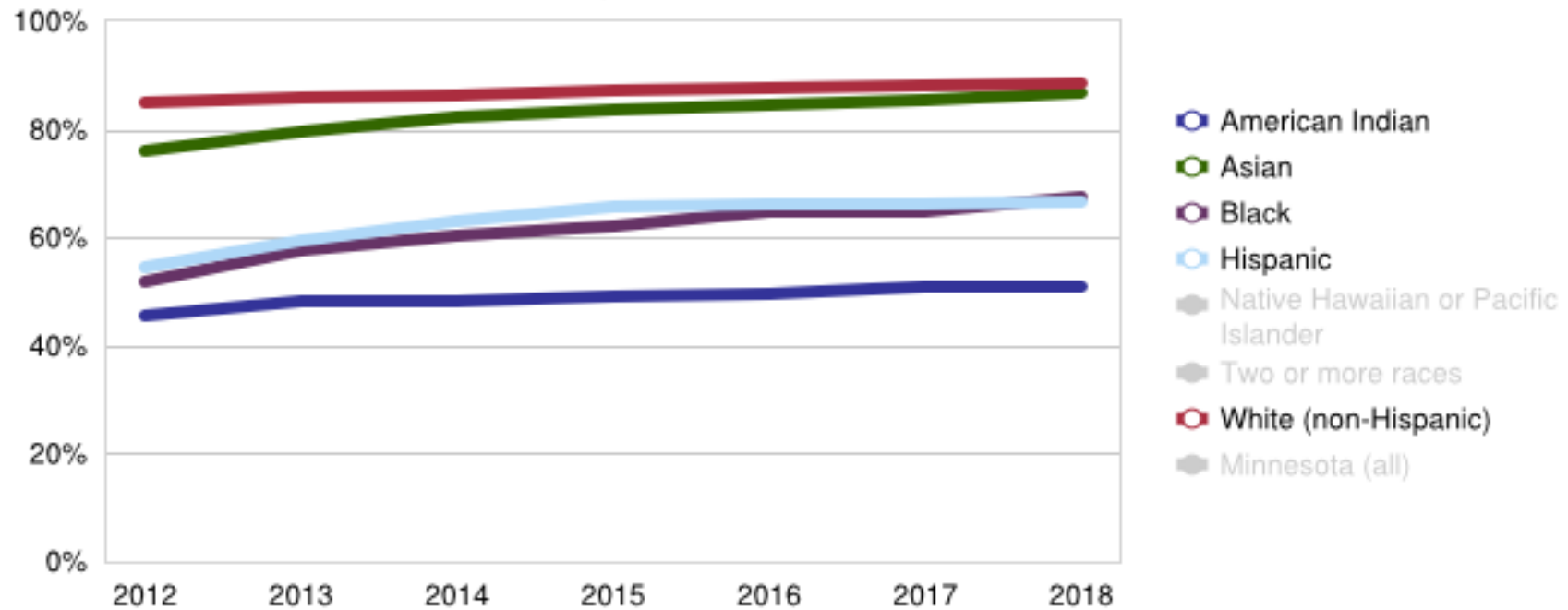
Right now: Baby boomers are leaving the workforce



Racial disparities persist in Minnesota

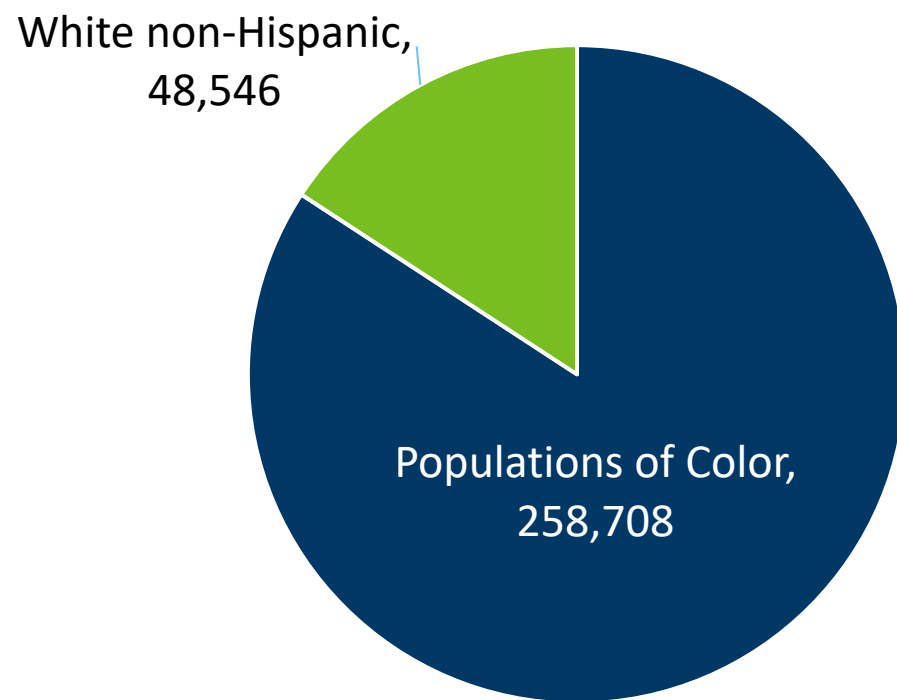
High school students graduating on time by racial and ethnic group

Minnesota, 2012-2018



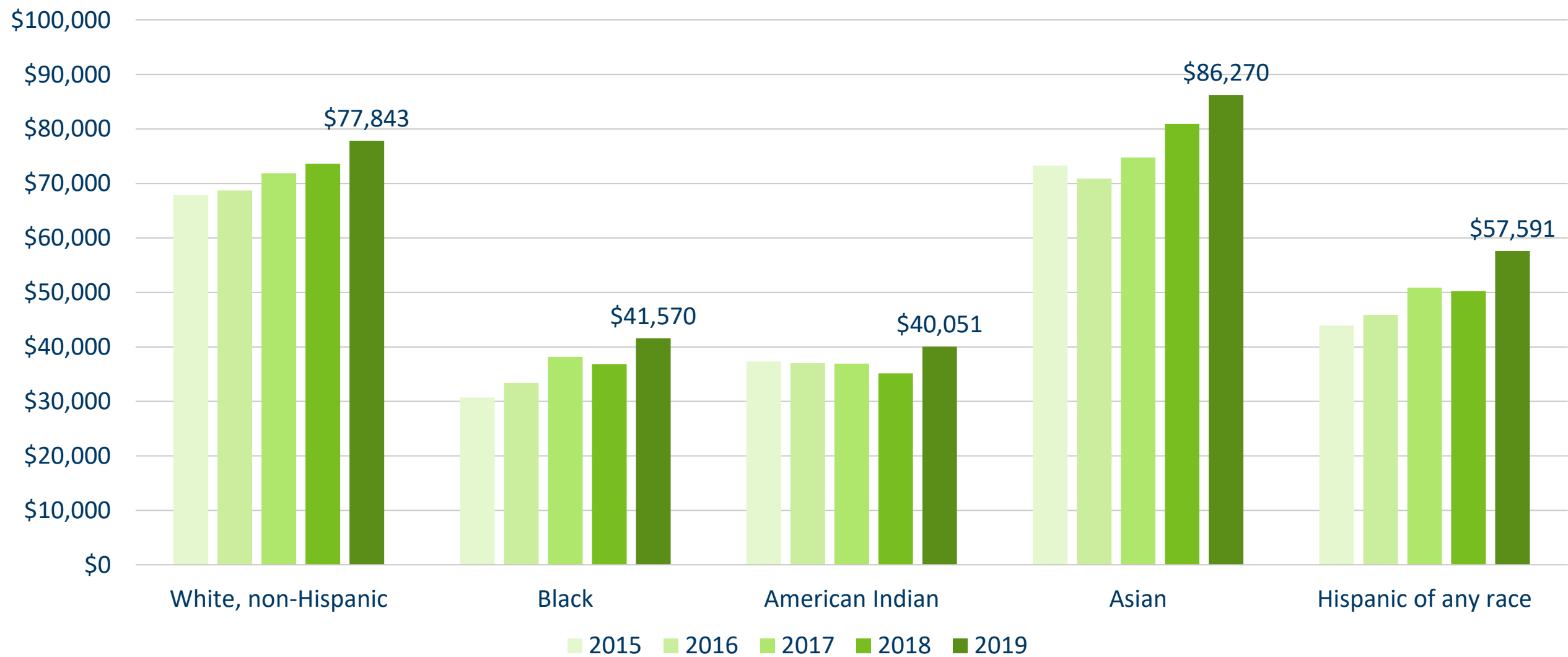
Growth in Minnesota is attributable to populations of color

Population growth by race, 2010-2018

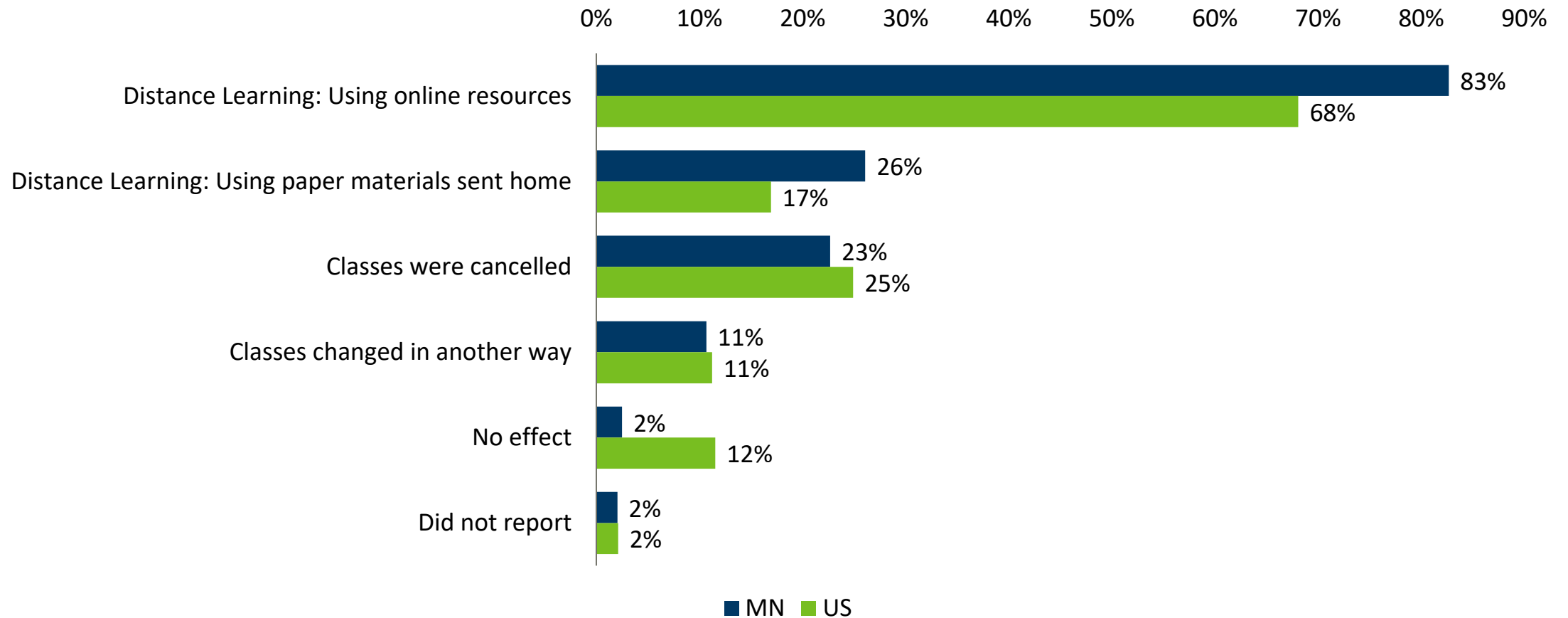


Median Household Income by Race (2019 dollars)

Household Pulse Survey: Changes in schooling due to COVID-19



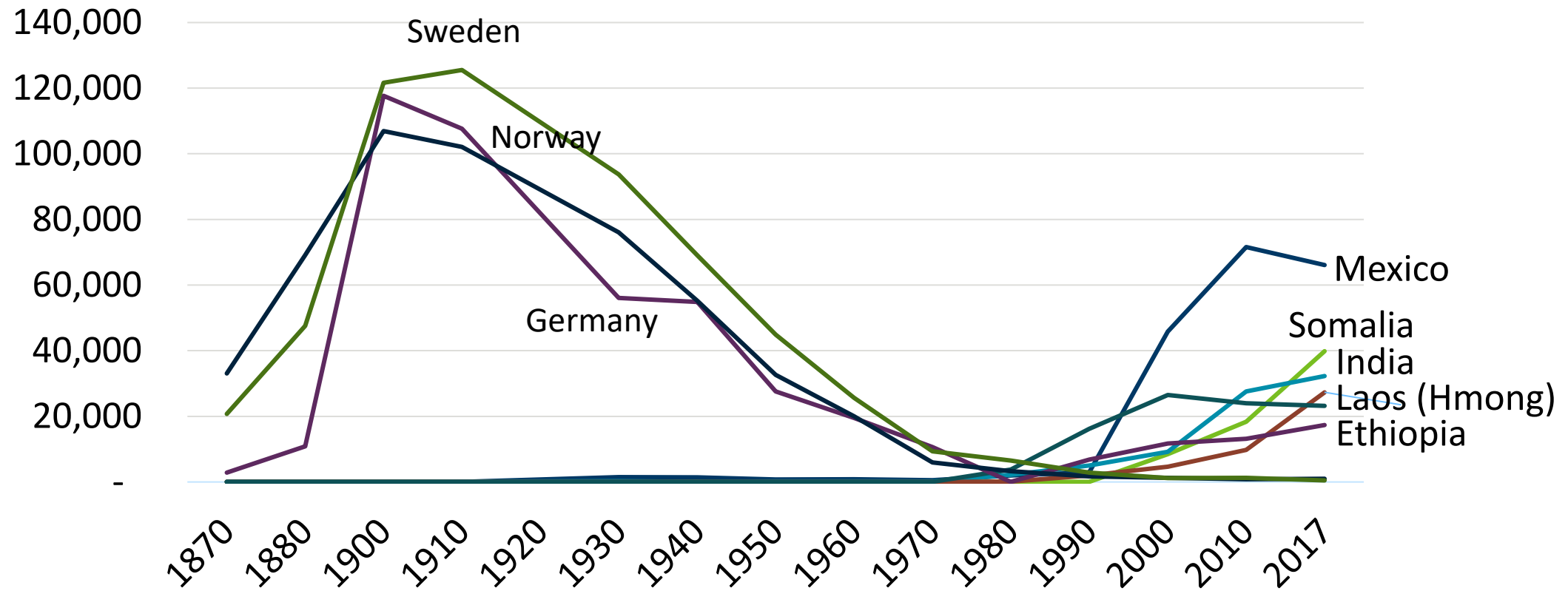

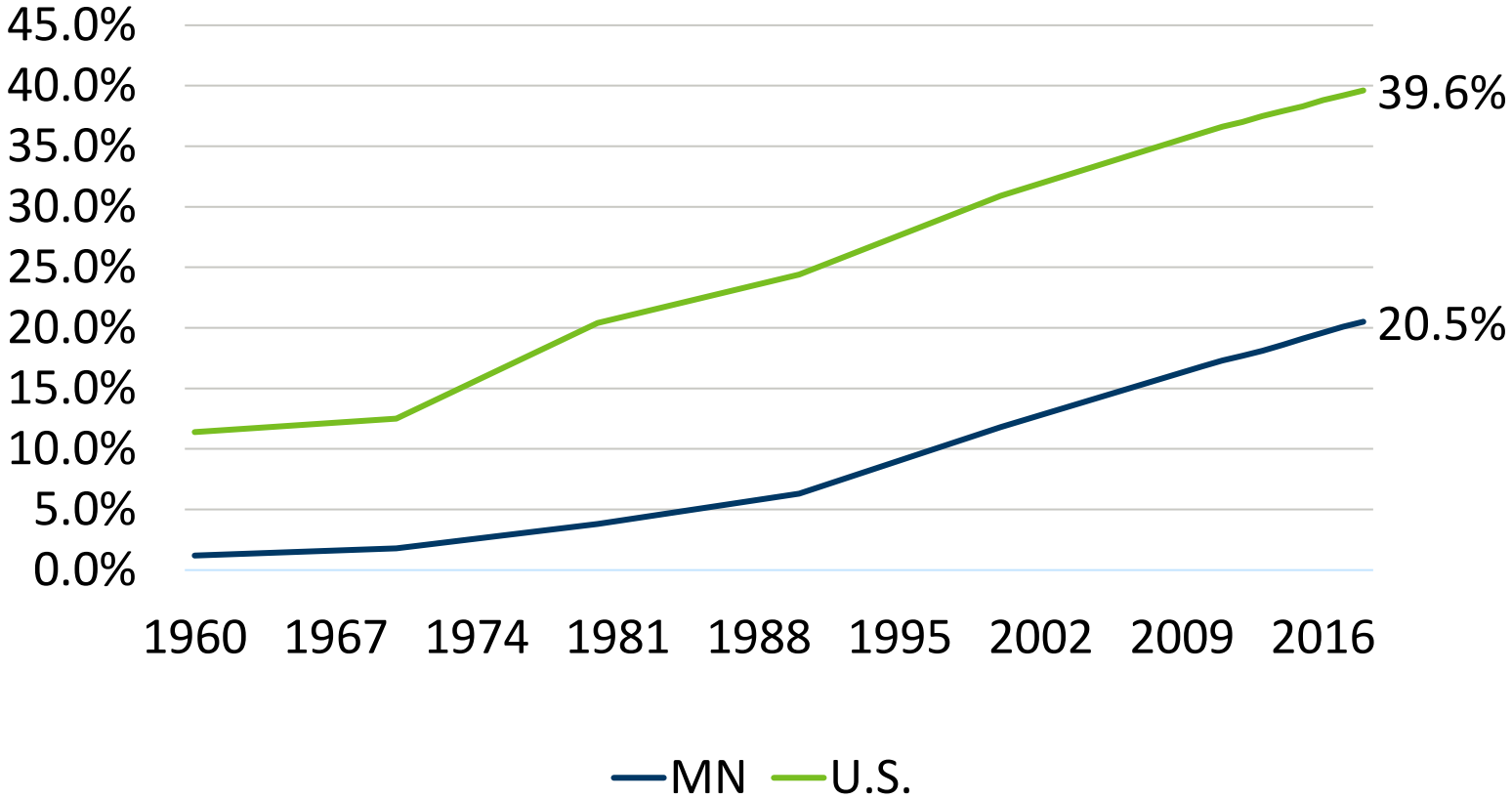
Foreign born in Minnesota

Percentage Populations of Color

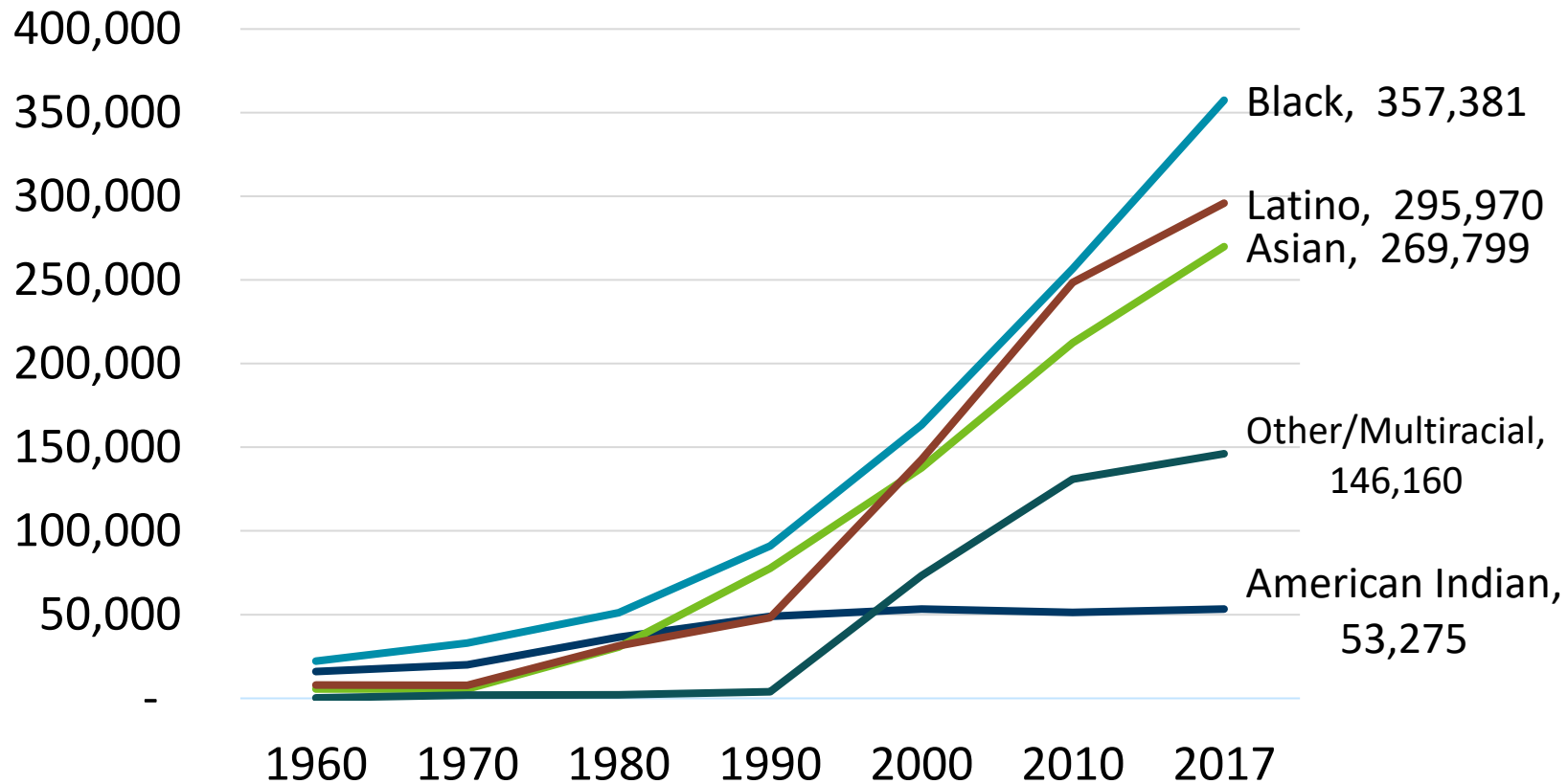


At .5 percentage points per year:

- 21.5% in 2020
- 26.5% in 2030
- 31.5% in 2040
- 36.5% in 2050

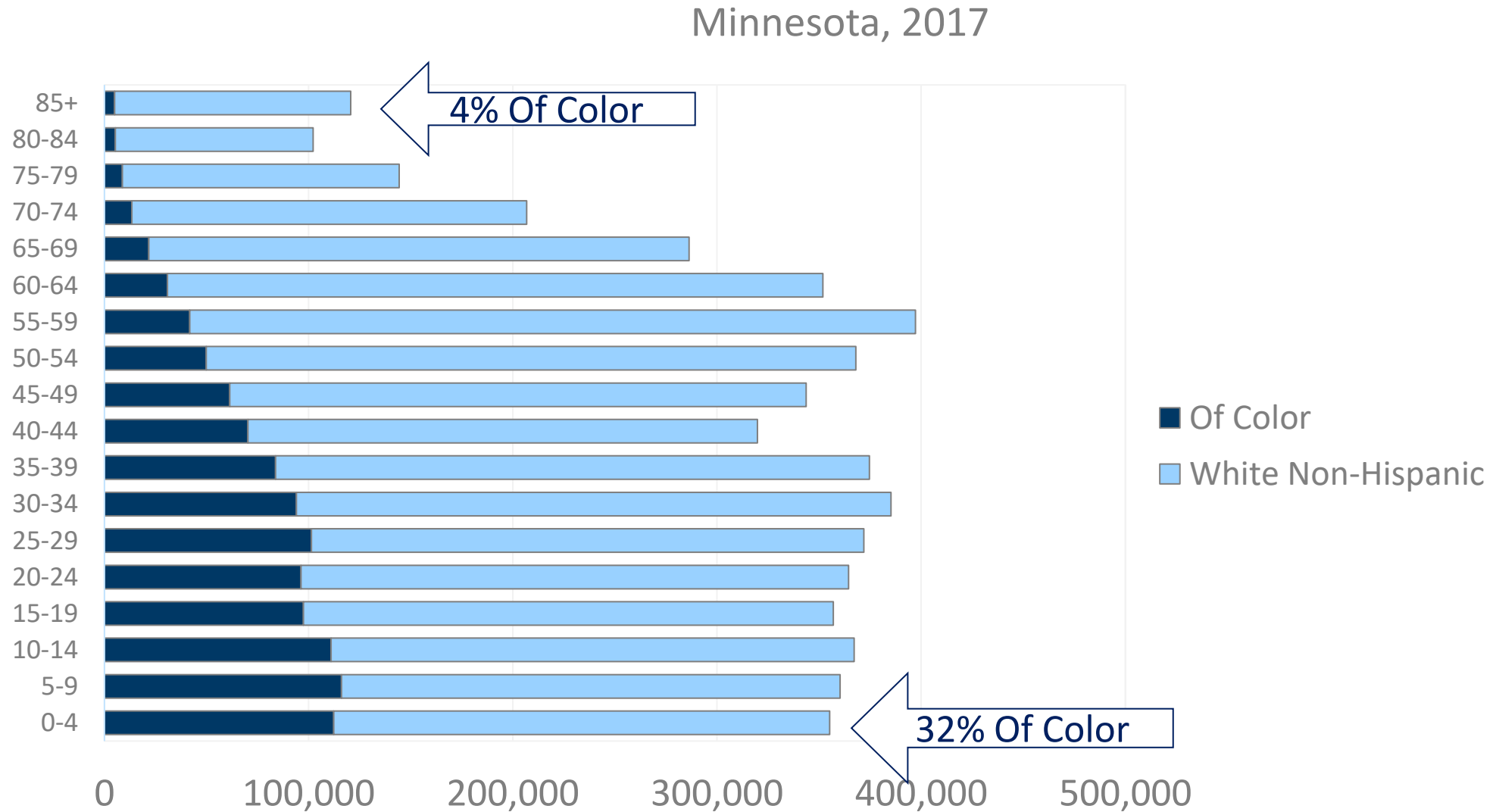
BIPOC populations now jointly total more than 1 million in MN, 20% of the population
